A gable-fronted style of conservatory adds a sense of grandeur to any home

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With a high roof slope and the same floor space as a Georgian, a Gable offers excellent use of internal space. The front panel of the roof remains upright rather than sloping back to the centre as on a Georgian, creating a feeling of great height within the conservatory.











The Georgian design is ever more popular, mainly due to the way it optimises space, as the 90° corners are perfect for sofas and tables.

Many buyers favour the Georgian which is a flat-fronted style that offers excellent use of floor space due to a square or rectangular internal shape Each side of the roof slopes back to the centre and the resulting contemporary style is suited to the majority of properties.









Victorians are available in:

- **three facet style** a bay front that has three main windows that give an angled appearance.
- **five facet style** a bay front with five main windows creating a more rounded appearance.

Victorian is a popular and versatile, yet traditional style of conservatory.

Its distinguishing architectural feature, a bay front, with either an angled (3 bay) or slightly curved (5 bay) front, combined with a steeply pitched roof and ornate ridge details give this style of conservatory a more classical appearance.

A lean-to mono pitch (one slope) style can have a shallow pitch which could fit under a low bungalow eaves, whilst a steeper pitch would match the roof of a terraced or detached house.





The lean-to-style could be for those who prefer clean understated lines.

Traditional or contemporary, this style is ideal for properties with limited space under the eaves or an awkward area in which to fit a conservatory. This flexible style can also feature solid walls at both ends or one end to give a more substantial room like feel.

A 'T' shaped conservatory like this one is classically styled and themes perfectly with the architectural grandeur of the property to which it is attached.

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At Coral, architectural design principles are important to us.



Conservatories that are extremely large and require additional support to take the weight of the roof are known as large span conservatories and require a 'portal' framework (support).





Coral can create virtually anything from a magnificent swimming pool enclosure to large commercial extensions; anything is possible due to the flexibility and advanced engineering of the large span glazed roofing system. Choosing a lantern style conservatory ensures drama and style, representing the grandeur of times gone by. The two-tiered effect adds a new dimension to your conservatory and the extra ceiling height adds to the feeling of light and space.

Lanterns are typically suited to older style period properties and are often chosen for swimming pool enclosures or larger conservatories and can be built in conjunction with a portal support frame.

Conservatories have always been an excellent way for consumers to blur the margin between home and garden, but Coral is taking the idea to a new level with its Veranda glass extension.

The glazing bars in the roof oversail and carry the glass with it, to form a 'cocoon' where you can sit in the garden and be protected from the worst of the elements. The exciting thing is, there are a multitude of creative ways to use the technology.



By using large in-line sliders or bi-fold doors, a much bigger space can be created to enjoy the Veranda making it perfect for family barbeques or parties and you can 'cocoon' yourself from the worst of the elements whilst still sitting in the garden!

The light, bright and airy interior will add a new dimension to your home and provide a seamless link between your home and garden. Externally the Orangery features a flat roof around the perimeter along with a structural grade aluminium roof capped and clad with low maintenance thermal pvc cappings and claddings.



For those wanting style - with a flat roof element all round to create what some call an atrium roof - the Traditional Orangery is the perfect option.

Choose from either a version with masonry parapet walls or a version with a fascia perimeter, both feature a flat roof around the perimeter.

It provides a touch more privacy than a conservatory due to the brick pillars which distinguish this style. The interior height of the Orangery roof provides a breathtaking focal point through which light floods into your home, and allows for breathtaking views of the sky above.

The atrium itself can have substantial glazing bars for a robust looking solution or glazing panels can be optimised for the maximum view of the sky.

Perfect for those seeking an extension in total harmony with their home. The vaulted ceiling gives your new living space an even more spacious feel that you will use all year round.

Lightweight and structurally sound

With a tiled roof, it is important to consider the exact location in which it will be installed and that the extremes of weather are taken into account during the design process.

Specialist software ensures that every Ultraroof is structurally engineered to withstand the worst potential wind and snow loads for your specific full postcode – providing you with complete peace of mind, whatever the weather. After a heavy snowfall, snow places considerable weight on the roof and this will be less likely to melt on a highly thermally efficient tiled roof than it would be on a glazed conservatory roof.

It is vital, therefore, that the original glazing bars that were designed for glass are removed and that the roof is lightweight, so the frames are not overloaded and are able to withstand the weight of the snow. The lightest tiled roof on the market – only 38 kg/m²



Authentica - 1

Authentica -1 is a new type of extension, using as it does off site fabricated super insulated columns in place of on site manufactured brick piers.











An Authentica -1 incorporates the super insulated narrow columns, Prestige insulating pelmet and a central light board, which together address the three main heat loss areas, transforming a conservatory into a thermally efficient Authentica extension. This will keep the room cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter, reducing your heating bills by up to 30% when compared to a standard conservatory. The central light board itself allows a new range of lighting designs for your extension. This coupled with the option of downlighting in your insulated pelmet will make your extension inviting and welcoming in the evenings too.

Externally the Authentica -1 is beautiful, enhancing any home. The Authentica -1 columns together with the Prestige Cornice create a wonderful look and feel, that enhance old and new properties alike. Cut-away diagram of a super insulated column

Authentica - 2

With the Authentica - 2 you have at your disposal an exceptional range of design options, each giving you the ability to stamp your own personality on every aspect.







Design options include multiple wide or narrow super insulated columns sitting on or off aluminium plinths, topped with the full Classic Cornice outside, internally insulated with a LivinSTYLE perimeter ceiling, warmed by Authentica panel heaters. Whether you're seeking a minimalist look or want to maximise the wow factor, you'll have every opportunity to create a stunning Authentica extension to suit your budget and your home.

Step by step installation

Installing a conservatory, orangery or glazed extension is a 'full on' building project. Here is a snapshot of what is entailed.





The proposed site

Space may be required for a skip during the groundwork stage.



The ground is cleared as part of the preparation process.



Footings are dug to a minimum depth of 450mm - this will vary depending on the ground conditions.



The concrete is floated to form a level surface area to build upon.



The outer leaf of the cavity wall is built to just below outside ground level.




Floor insulation and a damp proof membrane

are laid over the sand.



Concrete 100mm thick is laid to bring the slab up to the finished floor level.



The concrete is floated to a smooth surface level.



Cavity trays may be installed depending on the porosity of the house masonry. Otherwise a standard flashing is used.



The dwarf walls are built to the height agreed and will include insulation in the cavity wall.



The PVCu external cill is fitted to the dwarf wall and the erection of the side frames begins.



On completion of the frames a structural aluminium eaves beam is fitted to the head of the frames.



Now the roof is built - the glazing bars are fixed from the eaves beam to the ridge.



The chosen glazing panels or sealed units are installed.



The glazing is installed into the side frames.



The door is glazed.



All the finishing touches are added to the conservatory, including the sealing of the side frames against the house wall.





Environmental control

Now you have chosen your Conservatory or Orangery you will want to use it to its full potential. That means you need to give some thought to how you are going to heat it on those cooler days and cool it down on the warmer ones.

Because the weather seems to change so quickly these days you need a system that will react immediately. Coral can offer you the ideal Air Conditioning unit to suit not only your budget but also give you year round comfort with cold or warm air.

Wall mounted Air Conditioning units are popular with most people because they are mounted high up in the room and merge into the background. We also offer a floor level unit for those people who prefer a more traditional position. Whatever your preference Coral have the ideal unit to give you all year round use of your new Conservatory or Orangery.

This vertically mounted electric radiant panel heater is space saving and ultra efficient. It is available in a choice of two colours/finishes which will integrate into most furnishing schemes.

Glazed roof features and additional options


There are a variety of factors to consider to ensure you enjoy your new building. Here we explore just some of the considerations.

Climate control

It's vital to the maintenance of a comfortable environment - ventilation is often overlooked by some manufacturers, but Coral's roof systems take care of it.

The type of ventilation needed is specific to each conservatory, based on many considerations such as size, shape and most importantly, aspect in relation to the sun. South facing conservatories need to take into account the direct sunlight they receive in summer, whilst north-facing sites need to consider heating options for the colder months of the year. Other factors to consider include overshadowing of the conservatory from obstacles such as trees and buildings and the severity of wind and snow in your area.

If all this sounds complicated, let Coral help you select the best ventilation options for your conservatory. Ventilation is key within the structure of conservatory roofs, so you can be assured that by choosing a conservatory with a Coral Premier roof you're protecting your conservatory from the elements and the potential for problems. By specifying a conservatory with a Coral roof, you will be able to benefit from these ventilation features and enjoy your conservatory more of the year and your conservatory will have a long, troublefree and low maintenance lifespan.



Opening roof vents

Better than a window, a roof vent is a fast and effective way of allowing warm air to leave your conservatory. Our roof vents are supplied with either manual or electric openers. If you opt for electric openers then thermostats and rain sensors will allow for automatic opening and closing.

Trickle ventilation system in the ridge and lean to wall plate

As warm air rises, Coral have developed a ventilation system to allow this air to



escape via the roof, minimising the possibility for condensation to form.

Eavesflow



A trim that fits between the wall sideframe and roof, with built in ventilation and a slider on/off control button.

High performance glass

If you're specifically wanting to bring a lot more light into your home, then a glass roof is the right choice for you. High performance roof glass works by deflecting heat from the sun in Summer to keep the inside of the conservatory cooler and by retaining the warmth from heating appliances in the Winter. It also features a true self clean coating that uses the power of the sun to break down organic deposits and then uses rain water to wash most of it away.



Crestings & finials

Crestings and finials are the decorative fittings that run along the top of your conservatory roof. There are options to suit all tastes. Mix and match your choices or have none at all.



Colour options

The foil laminated products used on major items in the roof and on the PVC side frames, have a real woodgrain texture to add a further dose of character. The products can be coloured one side or both, with the possibility to mix colours between the outside and the inside. Can't see the colour you want? Ask for a bespoke colour and we'll paint the conservatory in our factory!

And lets not forget about standard white and the two traditional colours Light Oak and Rosewood. Colour applied correctly has a profound positive effect on your wellbeing. It strongly influences how we interact with each other and our surroundings... so do you stick to conventional conservatory colours and finishes or do you choose something different?

Window/roof interface

On Coral's Premier roof we use a decorative trim at the interface of the side windows and roof - the perfect finish.

Highly Insulated

The Premier Roof is the most insulated glazed roof that it is possible to buy. For example: The bars that run between the panels in the roof of your conservatory are covered with protective top cappings and through the use of chambered technology aid the thermal efficiency of the roof.



Tie bars

A tie bar is sometimes specified to help support the weight of a large roof or one that is fitted with glass. The position of the tie bar is dictated by engineering principles, and so they must be fitted. See p14 for a large picture of a roof featuring a tie bar. Coral, however has developed a range of structural components to remove the necessity of tie bars in many projects. Please speak to us to find out more about this option.
